1 MÅSØY MUNICIPALITY'S CHILD AND YOUTH AND CULTURE SERVICES

Interdisciplinary and holistic efforts are essential to child and youth and culture services. To achieve this, one must be familiar with the services available and know when, where, and in what way one can seek advice, guidance and cooperation in specific cases.

This information folder is designed to provide a complete overview of interdisciplinary meeting places and programs for children and young people in Måsøy. The descriptions primarily include programs and services under municipal auspices; some programs and services have also been included that are under the auspices of the specialist health service, the voluntary sector, and others.

The goal of creating such an overview is to make it easier for parents and guardians, and employees in kindergartens, schools, care services and other players, to find out what services are available in Måsøy. A description has been given of which players offer the various programs and services. As far as possible, it is also stated how to apply, or receive an administrative decision on the various programs and services, and how to get in touch.

1.1 THE INFORMATION FOLDER IS ORGANISED AS FOLLOWS:

Part 2 lists programs and services for children and young people under the auspices of Måsøy municipality for the age group infants and toddlers up to the youth group.

Part 3 contains a description of interdisciplinary collaborative arenas, both regular meeting points and meetings that can be arranged for individual children or young people. In Måsøy municipality, the district pedagogical-psychological service (PPD) has an inter-municipal cooperation with Porsanger. The child welfare service is engaged in a host municipality cooperation with Hammerfest municipality.

Part 4 is a non-comprehensive overview of services provided by the voluntary sector and other regional and national players.



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2 MUNICIPAL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

2.2 THE CHI	ILD WELFARE SERVICE
Who are we?	The child welfare service in Hammerfest is responsible for child welfare services in the municipalities of Hammerfest and Måsøy.
	The child welfare service shall help ensure that children and young people have safe conditions in which to grow up. The service aims to ensure that children and adolescents living in conditions that could harm their health and development receive the necessary help and care
What do we offer?	The child welfare service shall:
	*Contribute to providing individual children with good living conditions and development opportunities through advice, guidance and assistance measures.
	* Make sure that children's interests are also safeguarded by other public bodies. This entails cooperation with other sectors and levels of public administration when this can contribute to meeting the duties to which they are obliged fulfil by law.
	* Always first assess whether it is possible to help the child / family in the home with the help of preventive measures, such as advice and guidance, support contact / visiting home for the child, support for leisure activities, assist in providing a place in kindergarten or SFO (the before and after school program).
	It is only if preventive measures do not help the situation that it may be appropriate to place the child outside the home. Placement outside the home can be carried out with the consent of the guardians as an assistance measure, or by the child welfare service assuming care of the child. A transfer of care only takes place in very special instances, and there must therefore be weighty grounds before a care order is made.
Target group?	Children and young people under the age of 18 and their families. If necessary and when the child consents, the child welfare service can provide services up to the age of 23.

Exercise is an important part of the treatment, and the physiotherapist can adapt activities and exercise programs to the individual.

2.7 THE PED	AGOGICAL-PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRICT SERVICE - PPD
Who are we?	PPD Midt-Finnmark IKS encompasses the municipalities of Måsøy, Lebesby, Gamvik, Berlevåg, Nordkapp, and Porsanger. The PP service has professionals with a broad background and experience in kindergartens and schools. All staff have a specialised education in special education within a range of topics. The head office is in Lakselv.
	The PP office in Måsøy is staffed by a PP adviser. The PP service cooperates closely with schools, kindergartens, competence groups such as district nurses, child welfare professionals and BUP. The Education Act and the Kindergarten Act provide the mandate for our work.
What do we offer?	PPD works in two main areas:
	Helping schools and kindergartens in working on competence development and organizational development (systemic work).
	PPD has a permanent contact person in the kindergartens (the director) and in the schools (the head teacher) who shall coordinate the PP service's efforts towards the activities in the systemic work. Regular meetings are held in accordance with the meeting schedule.
	The systemic work shall contribute to improving conditions for children with special needs. In discussion meetings, the kindergarten/school can discuss challenges related to the learning environment, relationships, professional difficulties, etc. with the PP service.
	2. Preparing expert assessments (individual work).
	The PP service prepares an expert assessment where required by the Education Act. Children may have an individual right to special education, to special educational assistance, postponed start of school, early school start, exemption from the duty to receive schooling, braille, sign language and alternative and supplementary communication - ASK. The PP service also prepares expert assessments on the need for special education for





	adults. The expert assessment shall, among other things, determine whether the child or pupil is entitled to special educational assistance or special teaching. This work includes observations, surveys, and evaluations.

Who are we?	A nurse, social worker and auxiliary nurse make up the staff. If necessary, we cooperate with several agencies: home care services, regular GPs, physiotherapists, the specialist health service, NAV.
What do we offer?	Our task is to provide assistance, advice and guidance to individuals with challenges related to mental health and/or substance abuse problems and people in crisis or who find themselves in a difficult life situation. We also have follow-up of next of kin. Measures can be made in consultation with the individual and as needed: • Surveys and goals for follow-up • Individual conversations, follow-up, advice and guidance where one finds it most appropriate and by appointment: by office visit, home visit, by phone • Administration of medications • Coordination and cooperation with other care agencies • Drawing up of individual plans when needed for long-term and coordinated services • Environmental measures

3 DESCRIPTION OF INTERDISCIPLINARY COLLABORATIVE ARENAS

3.1 INDIVIDUAL PLAN (IP)

Persons who need long-term, complex and coordinated health and care services, services from the child welfare service or NAV, have the right to have an individual plan drawn up. The plan should only be drawn up if the person wishes to do so. It shall describe what needs a person has for different services at a certain time and how these needs shall be met in the best possible way. The plan shall also look ahead and describe long-term goals for the person concerned. It shall be continuously updated and be a dynamic tool in coordinating and targeting the services provided. When a child or adolescent has been granted an application for an IP, they are also delegated an IP coordinator.

3.2 THE STATE CHILDREN'S HOUSE

The State Children's House is service provided to children and adolescents who may have been subjected to or witnessed violence or sexual abuse, or in case of suspected female genital mutilation or forced marriage. The offer is also for adults with intellectual disabilities. Adapted police interviews, medical examination and treatment/follow-up are offered collectively under one roof. The assistance provided in the children's houses shall be holistic, coordinated and equal to the extent possible, and based on the needs of the target group. Counsellors and psychologists at the children's house have expertise in several areas, and offer:

- Surveys and follow-up after adapted police interviews
- Take note of any follow-up needs for children/adolescents, and establish a continuous chain of measures
- Professional knowledge about mental health in children
- Expertise in risk assessments of young people with harmful sexual behaviour

Interdisciplinary consultation is offered via conference calls, video meetings or by the party seeking advice meeting the consultation team at the Children's House in Tromsø. The consultation team has regular meetings on Wednesdays from 12:00 to 15:30. The cases shall be anonymous.

The consultation team can only provide advice/guidance and cannot intervene or assume responsibility for the cases.

3.3 THE INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAM

The interdisciplinary team shall ensure that children and young people with complex assistance needs receive coordinated and holistic services.

In the interdisciplinary team, one discusses challenges or concerns related to a child's development, and where they need to be addressed from several sides. **Parental/guardian consent** is a prerequisite for different actors to exchange information about children and adolescents. The consent provided determines which services will be present at the meeting.

Children's groups or school classes can also be discussed, in which case consent is not collected.

3.4 "SAMMEN OM DET VIKTIGSTE" EARLY EFFORTS

The main goal of *Sammen om det viktigste* (Together for the most important things) is for employees in Måsøy municipality to really see all children and young people: their abilities, strengths and special needs. In order to achieve the goal, sub-goals have been drawn up:

- 1. All children and young people have good relational skills and experience safety.
- 2. All children and young people master basic skills.
- 3. All children and adolescents have a healthy lifestyle.
- 4. Måsøy municipality works systematically and in an interdisciplinary manner with a focus on Early Efforts.
